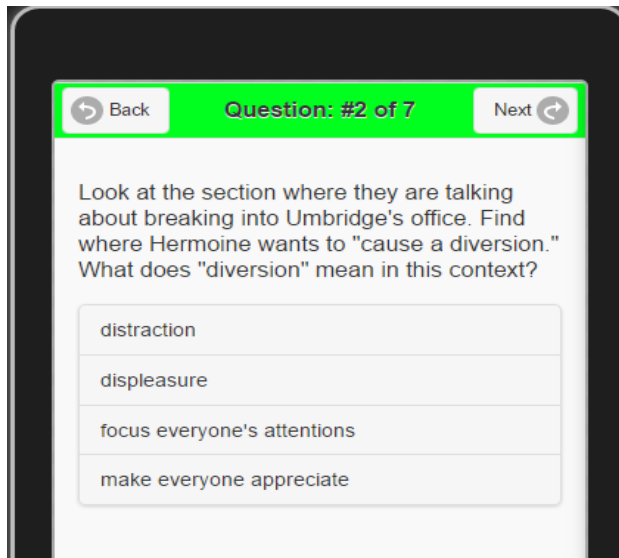


4. Important Vocabulary

5. Context Clues

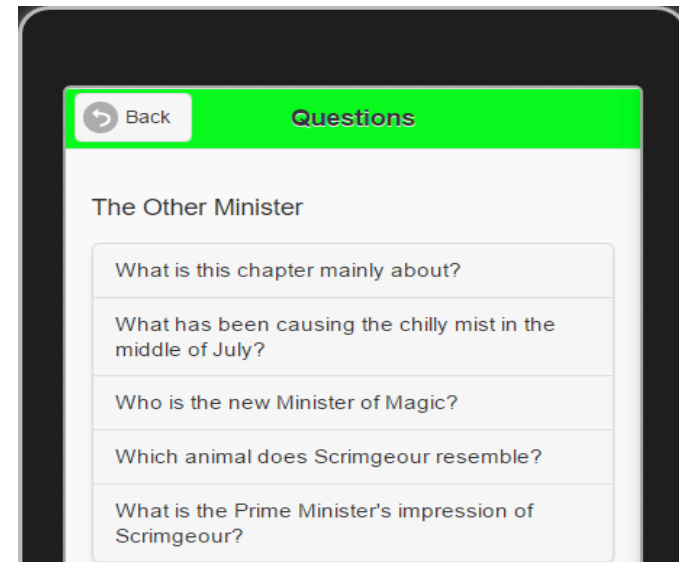
Using context clues to determine the meaning of words is also important. These questions ask students to identify parts of the text that can help determine a word's meaning.

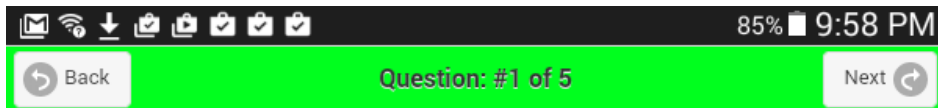

1. Main Idea

Main idea questions ask students to synthesize information and use text features like titles to determine the primary meaning of the text.

2. Important Details

Students should be able to find critical details that support the main idea of the text.



3. Supporting Evidence

Finding supporting evidence is crucial. We ask students frequently to identify the first 3 words in a sentence that shows their answer is correct. You would have to identify each possible sentence that supports the correct answer.
