Scoring

Written work is assessed for structure, mechanics, and content.

Structure refers to the overall organization of the writing. A cohesive, successful attempt will have clear topic sentences to introduce each paragraph or idea, supporting details to explain each idea, and conclusions to summarize the ideas. Successful mechanics show appropriate grammar at the sentence level and include correct spelling.

Grammar does not need to include specific elements, like commas or transition words, but it should not inhibit readers' understanding. Very minor point deductions reflect grammatical mistakes for incomplete sentences or misspelled words.

Content includes the prompt response and author's voice. The author's voice is an essential part of developing writing skills, particularly in the context of artificial intelligence concerns. Successful writing will clearly reflect the author's unique written voice and vocabulary. Additionally, the author's ideas show a thoughtful response to the prompt. The chosen job is accurately described and reflects a real job in the student's community. Additionally, a clear claim is supported by details and persuasive reasoning.
